Meetings, Attendance Policy and Proxy Procedures

The Hanover County Republican Committee typically has meetings on the second Thursday of the month, for each month except July and December.

We always send notice 7 days prior to the next meeting. If you're on our email list, you will receive an email with the date, time, place, and draft agenda for the meeting. The meeting information will also be posted on our website at <http://www.hanovergop.com>

If you miss three meetings in a row, you will lose your membership and your voting rights. Therefore, **if you are not able to attend a meeting, you should submit an "attendance" proxy.** You can do this online at <http://www.hanovergop.com/online-attendance-proxy/>

The person carrying your attendance proxy must be a member of the committee.

To facilitate the accurate record of your attendance, we ask each member to check in with representatives of the Membership Committee prior to the meeting starting at 6:30PM. **Once you have checked in you will receive a attendance card. Please initial the card and return it at the conclusion of the meeting.** You are encouraged to arrive early to allow time for attendance procedures. Business meetings begin at 7 PM.

If you miss three meetings in a row without an attendance proxy, don't panic. Your membership can be re-instated at the next meeting you attend. No other action is necessary.

VOTING

Votes are taken during committee meetings for a variety of reasons.

A member (or non-member with a “voting proxy”) may cast no more than one vote when a vote is taken.

If you are not able to attend a meeting and you wish someone to vote in your place, you will need to fill out the paper Voting Proxy form and deliver it to the non-member who will represent you. This non-member will carry your “voting” proxy.

The person carrying your voting proxy should live in your magisterial district and must be a non-member of the committee. A member of the committee cannot carry a Voting Proxy because each person at the meeting can only vote once, and a member is already voting for themselves.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

What does the HCRC do?

Our mission is to find and elect Republican candidates for office who will promote our Republican ideals, and to help and assist the citizens of Hanover County, and assist elected Republican officials in the execution of their responsibilities.

What do the HCRC and the Republican Party in Virginia believe?

The Virginia Republican Party has a six-point creed that encapsulates our beliefs. In summary, the 6 points of our creed are the free enterprise system, equal rights for all individuals, fiscal responsibility, individual liberty, strong national defense, and the importance of faith in God for the moral fiber of the nation.

What types of people become active in the HCRC?

Anyone who shares our values.

What is a Magisterial District?

Magisterial districts are defined as a minor civil division that is a non-functioning subdivision used in conducting elections or recording land ownership. These districts are unique to counties and do not exist in Virginia's cities. Hanover County has 7 Magisterial Districts: Ashland, Beaverdam, Chickahominy, Cold Harbor, Henry, Mechanicsville, and South Anna.

What is the State Central Committee?

The State Central Committee is the governing body of the Republican Party of Virginia (RPV). Most members are elected, some are appointed, and some are non-voting members. Learn more here - <http://virginia.gop/state-central-committee/>

Why are meetings important?

Meetings are held to discuss current events and topics of general interest. This is a good opportunity to network with like-minded people, get information, and learn how to become more involved in the work of Hanover Republicans. Your time and skills are needed.

What is your attendance policy?

We expect our members to attend meetings. Of course, that's not always possible, so if that's the case you can ask someone to hold your proxy. If you miss three meetings without a representative holding a proxy, you will automatically lose your committee position.

Having a proxy is really important. How do I get a proxy?

You may fill out a paper proxy and have your proxy holder bring the form to the meeting. The form can be located in this document.

I'm new to this committee and don't know anyone. How do I find someone to be my proxy?

Your magisterial district chairman is always willing to carry your proxy.

Do I need to pay dues every year?

Yes. Dues are \$45 (subject to change at each Annual April meeting) and due by April 1st of each year. You can give it to our treasurer at the business meetings or you can mail it to the treasurer at the address on our website at <https://www.hanovergop.com/membership/>.

Can I ask questions during the meeting?

The time to ask questions during the meeting is during "New Business." When the chair asks, "Is there any new business?" new items may then be brought up by any member.

Who are my HCRC officers and what do they do?

How and when do the HCRC officers get elected?

Officer elections are held every two years on even years. The Executive Committee sets an election date and determines the method of election. The State Party Plan outlines the available methods.
